WHEREAS, 4-H annually reaches over 110,000 youth in Colorado, helping them become confident, independent, resilient, and compassionate leaders; and

WHEREAS, 4-H is nationally delivered by Cooperative Extension--a community of more than 100 public universities across the nation, including the Colorado State University Extension--that provides experiences for young people to learn by doing hands-on projects in areas including health, science, agriculture, and citizenship; and

WHEREAS, 4-H's local network of over 10,000 volunteers and almost 100 professionals provides caring and supportive mentoring to Colorado youth, helping them to grow into true leaders, entrepreneurs, and visionaries; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:

That the General Assembly hereby declares Monday, January 26, 2026, to be "Colorado 4-H Day" in recognition of the 4-H program's extraordinary efforts on behalf of Colorado's youth.




