**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101      **CONCERNING A LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF DAYS IN THE REGULAR**  
102      **LEGISLATIVE SESSION.**

**Bill Summary**

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The state constitution limits the number of days the general assembly may meet to no more than 120 calendar days for a regular session each year. The bill further limits the length of each regular session to no more than 90 consecutive calendar days each year.

1     *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2             **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-2-303.5, **add** (5)  
3     as follows:

4             **2-2-303.5. Time for convening regular sessions - procedure for**  
5     **convening earlier - duration of regular sessions.**

6             (5) UPON CONVENING FOR A REGULAR SESSION, THE GENERAL  
7     ASSEMBLY SHALL MEET FOR NO LONGER THAN NINETY CONSECUTIVE  
8     CALENDAR DAYS.

9             **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
10    takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
11    ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August  
12    12, 2026, if adjournment sine die is on May 13, 2026); except that, if a  
13    referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
14    state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
15    within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect  
16    unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
17    November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
18    official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
