## Summary of Legislation

---

The bill updates terminology from “acute treatment unit” to “behavioral health entity” to conform with existing facility licensing types.

## Background

---

[House Bill 19-1237](#) condensed multiple behavioral health facility licenses into one license type referred to as “behavioral health entities” and made conforming changes in statute.

## Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

---

The bill updates an incorrect reference of an acute treatment unit to a behavioral health entity. This results in no change to state or local government revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

## Effective Date

---

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
